9. Reports from Community Council Members

Peter had requested an update re the Banks Development. Aileen had sent an e-mail to Banks however it appears our main contact Siobahn Samson has left the company and Aileen awaits further information.

He also asked about the possible downgrading of Thomson Street as a main route. Councillor Campbell responded that this had not happened but the whole review of transport in Strathaven was proceeding and the issue of staggered parking on Thomson Street would be raised.

Les agreed to e-mail J Forbes about the maintenance of the Castle surrounds.

Les reported that the CARS project will proceed to public consultation in April 2016.

Margot indicated that the MuseumTrust is planning a further summer exhibition and they now have in their possession the Echoes archive.

Donald reported that all the former Sun Hotel flats are now sold which is welcome news. It is hoped that a proposed new paint job will ensue.

10. Reports from Councillors

Councillor Dorman reported she had been approached about speeding on the Hamilton Road. Councillor Campbell was not certain that speeding was an issue three. Councillor Campbell is concerned about parking around the schools and is seeking Consultation with schools about this. Councillor Cooper also noted by email her concerns and enquiries about parking in Kirklandpark Avenue.

Councillor Campbell noted possible interesting and beneficial housing developments at the Kirk Street site next to the Church.
